



Exploring Force and Motion with Paul Nicole

Last week, our Grade 5 & 6 students had the exciting opportunity to learn about force and motion in a very hands-on way. We welcomed **Paul Nicole**, who works in the outdoor education industry, to share how these important concepts are used in real-world situations.

Paul demonstrated how pulleys and multiple tow lines can make towing a raft filled with people much easier. By spreading the load and redirecting force, pulleys reduce the effort needed, while multiple lines provide balance and control. Students were fascinated to see how what they've learned in class applies directly to outdoor activities like rafting and wilderness expeditions.

Another key takeaway was the strength of a simple knotting technique. Paul showed how wrapping a rope around a tree **twice** greatly increases its grip, making it far less likely to slip under tension. This small adjustment can make

a big difference in keeping ropes secure and people safe.

We'd like to sincerely thank **Paul Nicole** for bringing science to life and showing our students how knowledge of force and motion connects with teamwork, safety, and adventure in the outdoors.


Grade 3 & 4 Cultural Day Visit to Lake Tyers Trust

They will explore the connection between people and land, learning why caring for Country is central to cultural identity and wellbeing. The children will enjoy hands-on experiences that help them reflect on the importance of respect, tradition, and community.

It will truly be a special day that broadens perspectives and strengthens our students' appreciation for the richness of Aboriginal culture. We thank the Lake Tyers community for welcoming us and sharing their stories so generously.
